Teachers Tool Room

Expectations of attendance during COVID:

Our expectation is that all of our children will be offered spaces in school due to their status as vulnerable children. We will be encouraging our children to attend school. If there are parents and carers choosing not to send their children, this will need to be agreed with the social worker.

PEP Meetings during COVID:

PEP meetings are expected to continue during this COVID lockdown and we will continue to attend and offer support in these. We do try to attend as many as possible, but there are some we cannot attend. If you feel there is a reason you would like a representative from the Virtual School to attend, please speak email us to let us know.

Pupil Premium+ funding can also be requested and allocated as normal, attached to SMART targets through the PEP.

COVID Testing in Schools:

The consent to do a COVID test on a child under 16 must be given by the person holding parental responsibility. This means that foster carers cannot give consent for a test. If a child is on a care order parental responsibility is held by their social worker and parents.

To ensure you have access the correct consent, Walsall Council social workers will be completing the consent forms after consultation with the child's parents and carers. Once consent is given the form will then be uploaded to the child's ePEP (document folder on front page). The tests can only be done in school, if the consent form has been uploaded to ePEP having been completed by the child's social worker or parents if the child is Section 20 accommodated.

If you have any further questions, please do not hesitate to contact us or the child's social worker.

Online training:

In partnership with ACEducation we are able to offer a free online courses to our designated teachers.

For all new designated teachers we profile a free online 'Introduction to the role of the designated teacher' course. This course considers the Role of the Designated Teacher and the impact on outcomes for children and



young people. It explores the responsibilities of the role and gives practical advice on topics such as preparing Personal Educational Plans. The course includes case studies and example PEPs with SMART targets.

Other courses on offer to schools

Adoption, post permanence and the role of the school

Previously looked-after children start with the challenges of their pre-care experiences. These do not just disappear when they move to a permanent placement such as adoption and may continue to have a significant impact on their learning.

Emotion Coaching

Emotion coaching is about developing the best possible responses to the behaviour of children and young people 'in the moment', intervening with the child as the behaviour is happening.

Promoting the achievement of looked after children in education

We need to better understand the reasons behind attachment behaviours so that we can increase our empathy and understanding and ultimately help towards better educational outcomes. This course provides teachers and support staff with the knowledge to inform their work with looked after children in education settings. It looks at where learning takes place, thinks about how to overcome barriers and be aspirational education role models for looked after children and young people.

Expectations of learning and assessment during COVID:

It is a very unsettling time for everyone at the moment and we know that parents and carers are making difficult decisions about sending children back to schools and nurseries. COVID Testing Consent

To confirm details regarding the COVID testing consent for children under the age of 16 on care orders.

We have also purchased subscriptions for Doodle Maths for all children in Year 1 -6. Doodle Maths is a digital learning platform which creates individual work plans for children from Reception to Year 6, with curriculum-aligned questions delivered in short, fun and snappy exercises on computer, tablet or phone. Little and often works best – just 10 minutes a day is all you need to boost your child's confidence and ability in maths.

Phonics Screening – Year 2

The Phonics Screening Check was introduced in 2012 in primary schools in England. All children in Year 1 take it in the summer term. Cancellation of the phonics screening check in June 2020 due to COVID, means current year 2 pupils did not take the check in year 1. The check has been cancelled for June 2021 now too, however it is still important that Key Stage 1 children have a secure foundation in phonics to support their reading.

Book of the Month

Book of the Month for EYFS - Big Words for Little People: Bravery, by Helen Mortimer, illustrated by Cristina Trapanese and published by Oxford University Press

This little hardback book creates a moment to focus on Bravery. It introduces words to talk about feelings with confidence and in a way that feels good. The engaging art style, fun characters and picture book feel make it perfect to share and, because it is from Oxford, it is packed with educational goodness to help children develop and grow.

Book of the Month for Key Stage 1 - One Hundred Steps: The Story of Captain Sir Tom Moore, by Captain Tom Moore and illustrated by Adam Larkum, published by Puffin Books

The story of the man who captured the heart of a nation in its darkest days, Captain Sir Tom Moore. A book about adventure, about family, about never giving up, and about what we can achieve when we work together.

This is an inspirational picture book, published in support of the creation of the Captain Tom Foundation, which tells the incredible story of the man who walked 100 laps of his garden and captured the heart of a nation. Fully illustrated for younger readers, and following the key moments from Captain Tom's incredible life, the book shows what is possible when we come together and never, ever give up.

Book of the Month for Key Stage 2 - Dare to be You by Matthew Syed

Space To Be is being developed in response to the experiences of families with a young person labelled as having complex needs, who feel they are being pushed over the limits of their capacity during lockdown, with reduced or no support. Enabling moments of joy, play and connection, the project's focus will be on sensory wellbeing for both adults and young people in each household, to explore new ways of being together, even in a restricted environment.

This show has been designed for children with complex needs and their families, it takes place over a week in their home and will work flexibly around each families routine.
